
Our Fernan Picnic was a great mingle of friends, food, music and fun. It was gratifying to see so many residents and



**** Snow Plowing ***

Depending on the forecast, we use a rule of thumb to plow our streets when we have approximately 4 or more inches of snow on the ground. It is important that you keep your cars off the street so the plows can clear the road without plowing you in. As an addi-

tional service, we also have the driveways cleared of the plowed snow. Normally, this is the responsibility to the home owners but Fernan realizes this is a hardship to many of our residents and chooses to include this service when street plowing. If you have a

car parked on the street and are plowed in then it is your responsibility to clear yourself out where you were parked. Please KEEP CARS PARKED OFF THE STREET FOR OUR SNOW PLOWS. THANK YOU and Merry Christmas






and swim team and plays the trumpet for CDA Charter Academy (sorry neighbors), Aubri just finished a very successful season with

THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING OUR OWN CITY

When issues come up we sometimes hear the question of why we do not annex into the City of Coeur d'Alene? I think it is important for all of us to know what a gem we have in our own city.



Our taxes are lower than Coeur d'Alene yet our property values remain strong. Our city council and leaders are approachable and will listen to residents if requests are reasonable.

The best part of being our own city is being able to protect and decide how we preserve this wonderful neighborhood. City living in Coeur d'Alene is condensed compared to us. We have large lots, wide streets and ample parking on our lots so that it is not necessary, for the most part to park on the streets. Our ordinances provide that we have extra wide streets, no 2 story homes to block views (unless they were grandfathered in), nice front yard setbacks and no front yard fences giving us a large open space feeling. Fernan has always been a highly desirable place to live. The beauty, proximity and access to the lake along with the convenience of in-town living and only seconds from freeway access make our location superior. The spralwing ranchers on large lots create a wide open feel of having space.

Our services are contracted. We contract with the Sherriff Dept to patrol our streets and boat launch

park. We have a very low crime rate and I think the sheriff office takes good care of us.

Our snowplowing is contracted and although not perfect, we go beyond and plow your driveway snow burms out from what the snowplow creates. Our rule of thumb is to plow when we have 4" or more. This is not always textbook but watching weather forecasts and temperatures we due our best to properly maintain with out unnecessary spending. The fact that they come out on call is AMAZING for the speed in which we can get our streets plowed.

As a city we can also sponsor our picnic. Our community is special and it is nice to have neighbors gather once a year to enjoy.

We also control of the Fernan Dam that allows us to control the level of Fernan Lake for the good of Fernan residents.

It is true we do not have a lot of revenue to re-pave our streets and replace sewer systems but we are consistently working with Coeur d alene and other entities to best mange our monies and resources. The city truly has your best interest at heart. It is in all of our best interest to maintain this city, and manage our money to get the most benefit for protection of our value and safety. We have a good system in place and would rather be part of our own system that a small part of some other BIG system. Fernan has been here since the 50's. Many families have resided here 50 plus years. We are seeing some of these legacy properties change hands now due to the property values and changing living situations of families. I do hope you read this and if you ever questioned why we are not part of Coeur d'Alene, you have a better understanding of why Fernan is unique and special to be it's own city.
